Tiffin Seneca Farmers' Market Sponsored by Sutton Bank

2023 Rules and Regulations

- 1. Tiffin Seneca Farmers Market, sponsored by Sutton Bank, will take place every Saturday beginning on May 20th through October 28. Markets will be held on Saturdays in Downtown Tiffin from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. rain or shine. Vendor set-up begins at 8:00 a.m. No one will be permitted to set-up after 9:00 a.m. for safety reasons, and no refunds will be given to a vendor who fails to set-up by 9:00 a.m.
- 2. All vendors must register with the Seneca County Farmers Market in Downtown Tiffin. The registration fee must be paid no later than one week prior to the market date. No refunds will be given for failure to show.
- 3. Vendors are expected to sell what they produce and are subject to annual visits to ensure that they are producing their own products. The majority of the vendor's sales should come from the sale of self grown or self made products. The resale of other regionally produced products is allowed but it should be communicated to the Market Manager and be clearly labeled for customer identification. 60% of the produce that is sold at the market **MUST** be grown or made by the vendor. We allow locally made baked goods, cheeses, jams, salsa, honey, soap, lotion, etc., provided that the processed foods have met all State and Local regulations.
- 4. The sale of live animals and flea market items is prohibited.
- 5. The Farmers Market will assign vendors their selling spaces. These spaces are standard normal parking spaces 10 feet by 20 feet. Spaces are assigned per the market's discretion for vendor balance.
- 6. The Tiffin Seneca Farmers Market is to first be a Farmers Market, therefore a minimum of 75% of the market's vendors must be selling edible products that were regionally grown or made.
- 7. Tables and tents are **NOT** provided and are the responsibility of the vendor. Vendors who use tents are strongly encouraged to secure them with portable weights. Tent stakes or anchors are **NOT** permitted to be driven into the asphalt or brick right-of-way.
- 8. Vendor's display must not impede pedestrian traffic on the sidewalk, nor are free-standing signs permitted.
- 9. Vendors will set their own prices.
- 10. Vendors are to clean their areas, remove all produce, containers, signs and debris at the end of the day.
- 11. The cost of participation is \$25.00 per market per 10' X20' space; A discounted price for a full season commitment is \$360.00.
- 12. The cost for non-profit organizations who wish to participate is \$15 per market/per 10' X 20' space.
- 13. There is a limited amount of outlets available for those who need electricity. The fee is \$50 for the season or \$10 per market.
- 14. It is the vendor's responsibility to obtain all the licenses and permits and to pay the fees required by Local and State governing bodies. This includes the vendor's license for goods sold for which a sales tax must be collected. If you sell by weight, scales must be approved by the Seneca County Auditor. To obtain a vendor's license application visit Seneca County Auditor's Office or call 419-447-0692.
- 15. Vendors must comply with all laws, ordinances, and regulations of the United States, State of Ohio, City of Tiffin and Seneca County General Health District.
- 16. Vendors are expected to speak and act in a courteous and respectable way to all market attendees and Market Manager. Offensive or abusive language will not be tolerated and may warrant immediate dismissal.
- 17. The Seneca County Farmers Market in Downtown Tiffin and its employees, volunteers or assigns shall not be held liable for personal injury or personal property damage or loss by vendors or shoppers as a result of presence or sales.
- 18. The Seneca County Farmers Market in Downtown Tiffin reserves the right to refuse a registration or vendor from participating, in which case the fee will be returned.
- 19. If a vendor violates any of the rules or regulations, the Market reserves the right to ask them to leave the area immediately. No refunds will be made in such an event.
- 20. A copy of all permits, vendor license and Certificate of Liability Insurance must accompany this application.
- 21. All vendors are encouraged to participate in the market bank program and their market bank agreement must accompany this agreement.

The market manager will train and meet with each vendor to go over product eligibility and program eligibility before the beginning of the market or at any time the vendor's product eligibility changes. This signed agreement does not automatically grant vendor eligibility to participate in these programs.



SNAP tokens are teal plastic and come in \$1.00 increments. Change should <u>never</u> be given on SNAP tokens, please work with your customers to get their purchase to the nearest whole dollar. SNAP tokens may only be used for EBT eligible foods that are outlined on the back of this page.



Produce Perks tokens are green aluminum and come in \$1.00 increments. Change should <u>never</u> be given on Produce Perks tokens, please work with your customers to get their purchase to the nearest whole dollar. Produce Perks tokens may only be used for fresh fruits, vegetables, herbs and plants that produce food.



Credit/debit tokens are in \$5.00 increments. Cash change may be given for credit/debit tokens. Credit/debit tokens can be used to buy <u>anything</u> that is sold at market. Customers are charged a processing fee for redeeming these tokens so that vendors will receive 100% of their credit token sales. If you currently accept credit card sales at your booth, please consider still accepting these tokens for market consistency and potential reward programs.



Women Infants Children Farmers Market Nutrition Program (WIC FMNP) vouchers are paper vouchers in \$5.00 increments. Change should <u>never</u> be given for these vouchers, please work with your customers to get their purchase to the nearest whole dollar. Fresh Fruits vegetables and the herbs listed on the eligibility guide are eligible for purchase with these vouchers.



Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) Vouchers are paper vouchers in \$5.00 increments. Change should <u>never</u> be given for these vouchers, please work with your customers to get their purchase to the nearest whole dollar. Fresh Fruits vegetables and honey are eligible for purchase with these vouchers.
